- 1) "Hidushe Harim" named after the Grand Rabbi Issac Meir,
the greatest movement in Poland. There were after his name,
thousands of synagogues, yeshivos and institutions.
- 2) All the students, hundreds of thousands, were sent to slave
labor. Most were executed.
- 3) All synagogues, institutions and yeshivos had libraries,
precious Torah scrolls, old manuscripts, rare documents,
special silver ornaments for each Torah scroll, religious

items of gold, hand-crafted cups and menorahs, old

Chanukah lamps from the 10th-16th century, all hand-crafted from gold and silver. To the best of my knowledge, all the gold and silver were melted and given to Swiss Banks.

- 4) Today there is the “Kiryat Chidushe Harim”. In Tel Aviv, at 24 Namirover Street, Israel, there is a community and higher Talmudic Yeshiva (college level) with over one thousand (1,000) students studying there. This place is the great memory for all of those institutions in Poland.
- 5) The worth of all the assets mentioned above (3) is one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000).
- 6) “Kiryat Chidushe Harim” will build a museum, have more Torah scrolls, have a scholarship fund, build a new dormitory, buildings for more new students, housing for young couples who continue in research, a park for the benefit of the community-at-large, computers for each

students, and other facilities to aid in the study of all the interpretations of the Torah and the "Chidushe Harim".
