This letter is to provide summary information for you on a project by project basis.

All the projects reach out to a population that includes a very high number of first-generation Holocaust survivors and their descendants, while the projects' target audience are double victims and double survivors: they lived through not only the Holocaust, but also decades of Soviet oppression when the basic rights to express their religion and culture were denied them. Our activities seek to correct this historical injustice and allow the Jews of the former Soviet Union to reconnect to their heritage and culture.


1. Family Literacy Initiative Centers

This project will serve 2,400 families every year
Average cost per family per year: \$1,477.50
Cost of program in the first calendar year: \$3,546,000

2. *Comprehensive Program in Jewish History and Culture*
This project will serve 4,570 youth in the first calendar year
Average cost per participant per year: \$1,061
Cost of program in the first calendar year: \$4,851,000

3. *Jewish Identity and Hebrew Language Programs in FSU Peripheral Communities*
This project will serve 3,600 people in the first calendar year
Average cost per participant per year: \$533
Cost of program in the first calendar year: \$1,920,240
